### New Uniform Items

We are excited to announce that as well as the PE uniform, the following new uniform items will be available for purchase from the school uniform shop from January 2019 onwards.

Cap	\$20.00
Bucket hat	\$20.00
Hoodie (optional)	\$50.00
Scarf (optional)	\$25.00

The school branded hat will be a compulsory uniform item from 2019 onwards and students are required to wear either a branded cap or bucket hat during terms one and four when participating in outdoor activities. The branded cap and bucket hat replaces the non-branded navy blue hats sold by Yarntons. The cap and bucket hat will be available to buy from the school uniform shop from 29 January 2019 onwards. Pre-orders can be made now via the school's [online shop](#) and collection can be made at the uniform shop from 29 January 2019 onwards.

2019 will be a transition year for the school branded cap and bucket hat. Year 7 students starting in 2019 are required to purchase either the branded cap or branded bucket hat. Our 2019 Year 8 students will have the option of either continuing to wear their current non-branded hat or purchase a new branded cap or bucket hat. From 2020 onwards, all students will be required to wear the branded cap or branded bucket hat.

A school hoodie and scarf will also be introduced in 2019 as optional uniform items. The hoodie is only permitted to be worn by students when representing the school at a sporting event. It does not replace the school jumper or jacket. Both items can also be pre-ordered now via the school's [online shop](#) and collection can be made at the uniform shop from 29 January 2019 onwards.
